Since 2011, the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has collaborated with 13 states to integrate benefits for this low-income population through a demonstration called the Financial Alignment Initiative.

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The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has several programs that encourage states to provide integrated care, a concept that provides the full array of Medicaid and Medicare benefits through a single delivery system in order to provide quality care for dual eligible enrollees, improve care coordination, and reduce administrative burdens.

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Box 1: Ex Parte Medicaid Renewals States must conduct ex parte (meaning “by one side”) renewals for certain Medicaid cases. This means that states must attempt to renew a Medicaid participant’s eligibility based on available information, using information in the participant’s case file as well as electronic sources such as Social Security Administration data, quarterly wage data, and ...

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Eligible for Medicaid and Medicare,”3 there are several ways in which states are currently using the D-SNP platform to advance such integration, including requiring that Medicaid managed care organizations (MCOs) offer an affiliated D-SNP.

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To address long-standing problems with Medicare-Medicaid integration, many states are participating in the Financial Alignment Initiative sponsored by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and others are pursuing alternative approaches to integration such as contracting with Medicare Advantage Dual Eligible Special Needs Plans.

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3.2. DSNP Contracting with States. To improve the integration of Medicare and Medicaid benefits, MIPPA--as amended by the Affordable Care Act--required all DSNPs to have contracts with the states in which they operate, effective January 1, 2013 (CMS, 2016b).

Medicare uses a star rating system for Medicare Advantage and Part D plans, and the availability of high-quality plans is not the same in every state. Not surprisingly, the popularity of Medicare Advantage plans varies significantly from one state to another, with only one percent of the Medicare population enrolled in Advantage plans in Alaska .

New research from AARP and Advancing States finds that two-thirds of states either have or will launch new initiatives to better coordinate care for people who are dually eligible for Medicare and Medicaid services over the next two years.

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The ADA's community integration mandate is separate from federal Medicaid law. However, states rely on Medicaid funding to help meet their ADA obligations, because Medicaid is the primary payer ...

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In Medicare, they account for 34 percent of spending and 20 percent of enrollees. In Medicaid, they account 32 percent of spending and 15 percent of enrollees. In 2013, combined Medicare and Medicaid spending on dually eligible beneficiaries totaled \$312.4 billion of which Medicaid accounted for \$118.9 billion (38 percent).
